All of our registrants must do CPD and their CPD should reflect their scope of practice




Webinars

At our last professional body meeting we discussed our plans to deliver a series of webinars for registrants, employers and managers of HCPC registrants. We are very pleased to have received funding from NHSE to undertake this work across the UK. These webinars will:

- Focus on delegation for professionals who are part of the support workforce, in line with the ambitions of the LTWfP.
- Address key misconceptions about delegation (such as delegation only being possible to another professional working in the same role as you).
- Explain the HCPC's expectations of registrants working at a level described as advanced practice.
- Promote the HCPC's support materials for registrants working at an advanced level to continue to meet HCPC standards.
