RECOMMENDATIONS

SET 5. Practice placements standards

This recommendation relates to SET 5.1 to SET 5.13.

Recommendation: The panel encourages the programme team to continue to develop and consolidate the management of its practice placements, which are already of a high standard, including considering pairing students on at least one placement and implementing new strategies for auditing placements.

Reason: Students and staff both commented on the positive learning experience which pairing students on placement could offer. The programme team also recognised that auditing of placements could be streamlined and made more effective, and we would encourage them to implement their ideas.

Commendations

The panel would also like to offer the following commendations to the programme team:

- For the very high standard of programme documentation
- For the clear sense which both staff and students had of the students' progression through the programme
- For the strong relationship which was evident between the programme team and placement educators
- For the overall quality of learning and teaching, especially in multicultural music improvisation and groupwork.
- For the Music Therapy Clinic at ARU and its use in the teaching of the programme.

The nature and quality of instruction and facilities meets the Standards of Education and Training.

We recommend to the Education and Training Committee of the HPC that they approve this programme.
